You've probably heard that recreational marijuana is legal in several states now, including Colorado.

So, you can purchase marijuana legally from licensed dispensaries, but once you have your new stash, where can you consume it? What are the rules?

Well, you can use at home. You can use inside or outside your home, in your yard, or on your porch—as long as you own the home. If you are a tenant, your landlord may or may not permit smoking of any kind on the property, or maybe the restriction is that you can't smoke inside—check your lease to be sure.

Some people allow marijuana use at their vacation rentals, but again, check with the owner! Most who are "420 friendly" will make it clear in their rental listings.

It's illegal to smoke in parks or other public places, or at outdoor concert venues. You can't smoke in your car (unless your car is parked...in *your* garage at the house you own). Some social marijuana smoking establishments are beginning to open around Denver, so there are a few other options.

It is also illegal to grow marijuana, even for personal use, unless you are licensed under the many statutes and regulations covering that.

You also can't travel with your weed. It is illegal to fly with it, or leave Colorado with your purchases. If you get caught doing this, there are a number of things that can occur. If you violate some of the travel, public use and possession amount statutes, the penalties can be pretty light--fines of around \$100, possibly a day or so of community service. But if you goof up and violate some of the distribution penalties, or possess more than is legally allowed, you can be arrested and face as much as 8 to 32 years in prison, for a felony conviction.
